2025 Youth Week at Fort Caswell

The Dates

Our reservations are for July 28th – August 1st. We will leave in the early morning of Monday, July 28th, and return late in the evening on Friday, August 1st.

The Program

The Youth week at the North Carolina Baptist Assembly is a week of Bible study, worship, and fellowship for youth in middle school and high school. College students are welcome if space is available. The worship services and Bible studies are geared to building up the faith of Christian teenagers.



The 2025 camp theme is "REMAIN", and the theme verses are John 15:4-5.

"Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing."

REMAIN encourages students to abide in Jesus so they would bear much fruit. This isn't a one-time

occurrence, but characteristic of a life devoted to following Jesus every day. The challenge to remain is to be there and stay there.

During the week, youth will participate in personal quiet times, large- and small-group Bible studies, large group celebrations, recreation, creative

worship, and church group devotions.

The primary worship leader for the week is the Rev. David Sons, Family & Discipleship Pastor at Lake Murray Baptist Church in Lexington, South Carolina.

David is a gifted teacher and communicator who is invited to speak each year at a number of churches, student retreats, summer camps, and on college campuses throughout the southeast. A graduate of North Greenville University and Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, David lives in Lexington with his wife, Allyson, and their three children.



Who Can Come

The youth weeks at Caswell are open to middle and high school students. To attend, a student must have completed the 6th grade. College students may attend if space is available.

The Place

The North Carolina Baptist Assembly is located at Caswell Beach, about 30 miles south of Wilmington, NC where the Cape Fear River enters the Atlantic Ocean. The camp is self-contained, located on the site of an old Army fort, hence the name, Fort Caswell.

Caswell is owned and operated by the Baptist State Convention. The weeks are planned and coordinated by the student ministry office of the Evangelism and Church Growth Team. Approximately 1,000 young people from across the state will be in attendance.

Lodging and Meals

This year, we will be staying in Live Oak, one of several "residence buildings" on campus.

We will have exclusive use of Live Oak which has two dormitory-style rooms, each holding 12 students each. Because of the nature of our building, we'll be tracking registration by gender, and can take up to ten boys and ten girls on the trip.

Live Oak does not have a kitchen or dining area. We will be eating our meals in the campus dining hall, and have our small group classes and our church group devotions in the campus classroom building.

Chaperones

We have space, and funding, for 4 adults, including the pastor. This will yield a ratio of one adult for every 4-5 youth. In order to satisfy the requirements of the church's Child Safety Policy, we must have two adult chaperones of each gender.

Chaperones will be responsible for general oversight of the group. From among the chaperones, we will also need to organize our small group Bible study and our church group devotions.

Transportation

We will travel together on the church bus, and in other private vehicles as necessary. All driving will be done by the adult chaperones.

What to Wear

The Assembly brochure contains the following guideline concerning appropriate dress.

"The Assembly is not a beach resort but an instrument in projecting Christ to others. Dress at the Assembly should be appropriate with our Christian ideals and standards at all times. For any evening worship service, dress as you would in your local church. For recreation and free time, dress should be casual as activities dictate, but always in good taste."

Short pants and halter tops are considered inappropriate for evening worship. T-shirts that depict alcoholic beverages, drugs, or profanity are also prohibited. Girls are required to wear one-piece bathing suits.

The Schedule

There will be an opening worship service on Monday evening, and a closing service on Friday morning.

The basic daily schedule for Tuesday - Thursday is as follows:

Morning

Personal Devotions "Wake-up Celebration" and Large-Group Bible Study Small Group Bible Study

Afternoon

Free Time (see "recreation" below)

Evening

Worship Church Group Devotions

Recreation

The Assembly provides a variety of recreational opportunities, including basketball, volleyball, softball, swimming (at the beach and in the outdoor pool) and fishing from the pier. The Fort Caswell R & R Building contains a snack bar and activities area. A miniature golf course is open in the late afternoons, and at night, after worship.

Safety

In the interest of making Caswell a safe and peaceful place for all visitors, the Assembly prohibits the following items:

Minibikes Music Boxes Firearms Alcoholic Beverages Motorcycles Metal Detectors Fireworks Laser Pointers Skateboards Narcotics Pets Smoking is prohibited in all buildings.

We will take basic first aid supplies. In the event of more serious injury or illness, rescue personnel from the Brunswick Co. Rescue squad will be summoned, and treatment provided at the hospital in Southport. The parent's signature on the Guest/Counselor Registration Form authorizes the Assembly personnel to administer appropriate medical treatment.

The Baptist State Convention requires that all participants complete and notarize a health form, authorizing emergency medical care. In addition, all youth must have a signed, completed Moyock Baptist health form on file. In the event of an illness or accident, every effort will be made to reach parents before medical attention is rendered.

Insurance provided by the Assembly and by the church will cover all participants during the week, both at the camp and in transit.

Qualified lifeguards are on duty at both the beach and the swimming pool during all recreational periods.

The Cost

The cost for the week is \$425.00.

Youth will also want to bring some money for lunch on the road on Monday, and for personal expenses at the Snack Bar or Gift Shop.

Fund Raising

Proceeds from our annual dinner theatre are used to help youth participate in summer youth activities. Youth receive a portion of the proceeds to offset their expenses based on their level of participation in the dinner theatre event.

A number of youth have credits available to them from prior years. Contact the church office to see if this applies in your situation. Credits may be used to pay for the cost of the trip, but not as a substitute for the initial deposit (unless you have enough credits to pay for the whole trip!)

No youth will be excluded from the trip because of insufficient funds. Other opportunities to work at odd jobs, baby-sitting, and so on will be given to youth in need of earning extra income for the trip.

Moreover, we have scholarship money available for youth in need of financial assistance. Speak privately with the pastor if you need information about a scholarship.

Reservations

The registration deadline is Wednesday, February 12th.

Our first payment, as a church, is due to Caswell on February 15th, and that payment is non-refundable. It is imperative, therefore, that we have an accurate count prior to that date.

To reserve a space, fill out the form below, and return it to the church office. Or, complete the form on the church website under **Events/For Youth**.

Reservations will be restricted to participants in the church's youth programs (Sunday School, Youth Fellowship, Puppets, etc.) until Sunday, January 29th.

After that, any spaces left will be made available to friends who attend other churches. Aside from this provision, reservations will be taken on a first-come, first served basis.

Deposits

A \$100.00 deposit must accompany reservation requests. If you must cancel, this deposit will be refunded only if someone else goes in your place, or we are able to cancel the reservation with Caswell.
